


**The ten non-Christian sources are:** 

- 1. Josephus (Caesar's historian);
- 2. Tacitus, the Roman historian;
- 3. Pliny the Younger, a Roman politician;
- 4. Phlegon, a freed slave who wrote histories;
- 5. Thallus, a first-century historian;
- 6. Seutonius, a Roman historian;
- 7. Lucian, a Greek satirist;
- 8. Celsus, a Roman philosopher;
- 9. Mara Bar-Serapion, a private citizen who wrote to his son;
- **10. Jewish Talmud.**

- **11. His disciples denied the Roman gods and worshiped Jesus as God.**



## Christ rose from the dead and proved that he was not just a man


