CHAPTER 7

MARRIED TO ANOTHER

This chapter has been called the chapter of "The Miserable Man!!" "I remember the day when I accepted his hand in marriage. I said that day - "All that thou sayest I will do". You see, our marriage was not based on LOVE - but on my RESPONSIBILITY to do all that my husband required. He never told me that HE LOVED ME!! You know, he was always right in what he required, but he would never And I had a lot of help me. He just told me when I was wrong!! ideas that were different than his – but I learned these ideas from my parents and had been taught them from the time of my birth by practice and precept. We did learn to get along a little better when he would not press a point! I actually was proud of my relationship with him - but then I remember the day he told me that "I should not covet." What a terrible time I had – I just could not please him no matter how hard I tried!! And until the day he died – all he could do was to point out where I had gone wrong - he could never help me. I am so thankful that I am no longer under his authority."

But then she is married to another under quite different circumstances. Now she might say:

"How I <u>LOVE</u> my husband and I am so sure of <u>HIS LOVE TO ME</u>! He <u>SHOWS ME</u> in so many ways - and he <u>ACTUALLY HELPS</u> me do what is pleasing to Him. I am so <u>dependent</u> upon Him. It is not bondage but <u>I love to serve Him</u>. When he has to "Press a Point", He helps me to understand why and then He helps me to carry out His bidding."

I was so thankful for the introduction of a new system called *NEW CREATION*. This new system uses the very same files, but without the effects of SIN being seen. But you know, I never have been able to get rid of the OLD ORIGINAL system and I have to be very careful when I use the computer as it is quite easy to start up and carelessly use the OLD ORIGINAL operating system instead of the NEW CREATION system." 5. As long as he DENIES the existence of the OLD ORIGINAL system, he will have trouble.
