Ephesians 1:4-10

If we watch the news or look at the newspapers of this world, we see that, according to man, things are 'out of control'! Who knows where it will end or what will happen? Our purpose in looking at these verses in the first reading is to see that just the opposite is true. To see <u>His</u> purposes coming to pass in the midst of the confusion of this world is what gives <u>stability</u> and <u>direction</u> to the believer.

Many of us are good <u>planners</u> but not so good at <u>pursuing</u> our plans. As we begin in Genesis 1, we find no place for those who were chosen before the foundation of the world to dwell – in fact, the man himself was not yet created! We want to dwell on several areas of Genesis and see the foundation laid for the blessing of man in particular but also for all creation.
