The Epistle to the Romans

Our desire this year is to take up selective portions of the book of Romans. As we know from the introduction, Paul had never been to Rome. We are not told in scripture about any Apostle starting this great work in Rome – only that there were "strangers from Rome, Jews and proselytes" in Jerusalem at Pentecost in Acts 2 vs 10. This epistle was written from Corinth to those "whose faith is spoken of throughout the whole world." The great theme is "The Gospel of God" and the desire of the Apostle was the great need for the believers in Rome that "they may be established." This remains a critical book for believers in the Lord Jesus Christ today to know and understand.

CHAPTER 3

Guilty before God Romans 3 vs 9 to vs 28.

Many are the distinctions that may be made amongst men to divide them into various classes. There are Jews and Gentiles, some are rich, others are poor, some are educated, others not, some are famous, others unknown, some very successful in their achievements while others are not so much so – but - there is one place where all are on <u>common</u> <u>ground!</u> Sin is the great leveler of the playing field as God views it.

CHAPTER 6

What is <u>baptism</u> to you? Is it a <u>historical event</u> with little or no relevance to your daily life? Many <u>spiritual</u> <u>battles are either won or lost</u> in the lives of many Christians because of a proper understanding or Chapter 6 – or an improper understanding of the principles given here. For this reason we will spend a considerable amount of time here. We will first consider the teaching of vs 1-10.

- 1. What does <u>baptism</u> have to do with <u>life?</u>
- 2. Has baptism to do with *heaven or earth*?
- 3. Verse 3 This is a *fact* that all believers should know about!
- 4. Verse 4 This <u>act</u> explains <u>what happened when we were baptized?</u> What do we do with a "<u>dead man</u>"? <u>Who is buried</u> in this verse? What <u>should be</u> the result?
- 5. Who is this "old man" in vs 6 and how is he crucified and why?
- 6. What is the *effect* on this "dead man" in verse 7?
- 7. How can a "dead man" be "freed from sin"?
- 8. Look at the tremendous result in vs 9 death hath "<u>no more</u> dominion over him".
- 9. Vs 10 Christ died literally! We do not Discuss
- 10. What does it mean for us to rekon yourselves to be dead?
- 11. Verses 12 -13 Discuss
 - A. Let not sin reign.
 - B. Neither yield ye your members.
 - C. Yield yourselves unto God.
 - D. Yield your members.
- 12. Vs 14 What does it mean to be under grace?
- 13. Vs 16 Discuss the two choices of verse 16? Which choice describes your life prior to EBC this year?
- 14. We who were once "in bondage" have now become servants again Discuss.
- 15. What was the end of the pathway you were treading in vs 21?
- 16. Discuss the great change of verse 16.
- 17. Discuss the great gift of verse 17.

We come now to Chapter 7. This has proved to be a very difficult portion of scripture for many real believers. We have heard of only one mention of the Spirit of God thus far in this book. That was Chapter 5, vs 5 and there has been no exposition as to the work of the Spirit in us up to this point. Many believers attempt to have a holy walk by putting themselves under the principle of the law rather than allowing the Holy Spirit to work in us. While we may have some comments on the first part of Chapter 7, we are going to emphasize 14 through 28. The struggle many have in this chapter is given for our learning.

- 2. Discuss the battle of vs 15! "That which I do, I allow not!" "What I hate, that do I." Discuss.
- 3. Discuss the lesson of Vs 17 "Sin dwelleth in me."
- 4. Discuss the conflict of vs 18 23.
- 5. Who is this "<u>inward man</u>"? <u>How does he feel</u> about the principles of God? Why doesn't he follow them?
- 6. How does he describe *his condition* in vs 24?
- 7. What does he need in this verse? _____?

Chapter 8

What a wonderful thing to come from "<u>O wretched man that I am</u>" in Chapter 7 to the opening verse of Chapter 8 – "<u>There is therefore no condemnation to them which are IN CHRIST JESUS?</u> He is no longer seen as "<u>in the flesh</u>" but "<u>In Christ Jesus</u>!" Discuss

- 1. I find then that it is "<u>The principle of the Spirit of life in Christ that hath made me free from the law of sin & death</u>. Discuss
- 2. Who solved the whole problem in vs 3. Discuss
- 4. Look at the results seen in vs 4. Discuss
- 5. Discuss "after the flesh" and "after the Spirit" in vs 5.
- 6. Discuss the 2 minds of vs 6 & 7 & results of vs 8.
- 7. Discuss the 2 possibilities of vs 9.
- 8. For times sake, we are going to look at vs 26 39 and take them on a verse by verse basis, not going into great detail but seeing the overall principle of the Spirit's for us and in us. As time permits we will look at vs 1 & 2 of Chapter 12.
